Call for Artists

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- Deadline for submissions is noon, Pacific Time, June 20, 2014.
- Open to all artists worldwide.
- To submit a parasol for the September 21st installation, artists are required to create an 8 in. x 11 in.- 2 dimensional study (front side and back side) of the proposed parasol design.. A blank design template will be sent as a PDF to all artists applicants upon request.
- All submissions will be juried in.
- Notification of juried results will be ongoing.
- A **minimum** of 100 works/parasols will be selected for the exhibition and installation. The studies and initial designs will be as criteria for the selection and the designs will be part of the exhibit..

- Once your study is approved and selected for the installation and exhibit you will be sent an actual 28 in or 32 in. parasol to design. (Selected artists are responsible for the shipping the parasols to the International Peace and Art Center)
- A short explanation of the artist's vision about their design must be included, along with a description of the medium.
- Artists retain rights to their submitted works, but grant The International Peace and Art Center rights to the digital reproduction of their submission(s) to include in The International Peace and Art Centers' future exhibitions, commemorative book, and any other merchandise produced to raise funds for The International Peace and Art Center or promotion of The International Peace and Art Center.
- All sales from each individual art work will yield 40% of the sale to the artist and 60% to International Peace and Art Center.
- The International Peace and Art Center will create a commemorative book featuring at least one submission from every participating artist.
- There is no limit to the number of works that may be submitted, however each additional entry must be accompanied with a \$10.00 entry fee for each additional work submitted!
- More than one piece of art work from an artist may be selected and included in the exhibit.
